

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS
BOARD OF LINCOLN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
June 5, 2007

Chairman Connelly called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Others in attendance included: Commissioners Archibald and Harmon; County Clerk, Jeanne Wagner; Commissioner's Secretary, Corey Roberts.

PARA 1: Commissioner Harmon moved to approve the agenda for this day and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 2: Commissioner Archibald moved to accept the minutes from May 14, 2007 and Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 3: Jerry Glasscock met with the Commissioners on the renewal of the Speed Enforcement Grant in the amount of \$13,500.00. Commissioner Harmon moved to approve the Speed Enforcement Grant in the amount of \$13,500.00 and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 4: Mary Crosby with LUAG met with the Commissioners on Teton Truss, Inc. Development Agreement. Commissioner Archibald moved for the Chairman to sign the Development Agreement between Lincoln County and Teton Truss, Inc on the waterline project for industrial development. Also, to include a contract at a later date between Lincoln County and Etna Water & Sewer District for the engineering contact. Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 5: Commissioner Archibald moved to sign the RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE PROPOSITION OF IMPOSING A ONE PERCENT (1%) TAX FOR GENERAL REVENUE WITHIN LINCOLN COUNTY BE PLACED ON THE BALLOT BEFORE THE VOTERS OF LINCOLN COUNTY AT A SPECIAL ELECTION, THE PROPOSITION OF WHETHER A (1%) EXCISE TAX ON TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY, ADMISSIONS AND SERVICES OBTAINED WITHIN LINCOLN COUNTY BE IMPOSED FOR THE PURPOSE OF GENERAL REVENUE. Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 6: Commissioner Archibald moved to approve the vouchers submitted and Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 7: John Stezenbach met with the Commissioners on the voucher for Teton County Sheriff's Office in the amount of \$1,000.00 for a feasibility study on a regional helicopter for Search and Rescue efforts. There are 4 other counties involved. This study included monitoring weather and days that a helicopter could be used if needed for search efforts. The Commissioners declined payment of the voucher.

PARA 8: John Stezenbach met with the Commissioners on the Spillman/Summit Computer System. The prior Sheriff had met previously with the Commissioners on a new system called Alliance/Cyrun. The only county using the Alliance/Cyrun system is Teton County. John stated the majority of the counties are using Spillman/Summit and he found that Lincoln County isn't using this system to the full extent. His recommendation is to stay with Spillman/Summit. The Commissioners told John to research how far the previous Sheriff went with the Alliance/Cyrun system and to report back to them as soon as possible.

PARA 9: Tony Tomassi met with the Commissioners on the South Lincoln Events Center and invited them to a meeting with the Architect on Thursday morning if they could attend. The Commissioners have pledged 2.5 million towards the project. He wanted the Commissioners to advance the 2 million dollars so they could invest the money and earn interest. Chairman Connelly said no. The County is facing a 1.5 million shortfall and the assessed valuation is down for 07-08. Also, the loss of revenue due to the food tax is unknown at this time. With 2 civic centers to fund, they need to spread the money obligations out and not give any lump sum amounts.

PARA 10: County Engineer, Ross Turner gave an agency update to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Harmon moved to adjourn for lunch at 12:21 p.m. and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried. Regular session resumed at 1:30 p.m.

PARA 11: Chairman Connelly called the meeting back to order at 1:50 p.m. Scott Stewart met with the Commissioners on the public liability on property that they own. Land owners along Ross Road granted an easement to the county for possible future use as a county road. The county has not exercised the easement and has not taken responsibility for maintain Ross Road with a sign to that effect notifying the public. There is obviously a liability concern for the county. Many local people use the road regularly, across private property, with public liability resting solely on the property owners. Since Ross Road is not a public right-of-way, the Sheriff's office will not provide traffic enforcement and many vehicles continue to travel Ross road at a high and reckless rate of speed. He feels this matter has been neglected for too long and necessary corrections need to be done to restore all legal rights and remedies regarding use of the private property(s) to the property owners. Planning Director, John Woodward gave a background on the road to the Commissioners. He stated with development in the area, it has become a main thoroughfare. The Commissioners, John Woodward and Ross Turner felt that a sign needs to be placed on the road designating it as a private road. Mr. Stewart still has concerns about their liability when people use this road. Chairman Connelly stated they need to have the County Attorney review this issue and will respond back to Mr. Stewart after his findings.

PARA 12: Years of Service Awards were presented to the following: Hal Hepworth and Laval Larson for 25 years. The Commissioners than met with Elected Officials and Department Heads.

PARA 13: County Attorney, Eric Phillips met with the Commissioners. Commissioner Harmon moved to go into Executive Session at 3:28 on a personnel issue and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried. Regular session resumed at 3:33 p.m.

Commissioner Archibald moved to adjourn the meeting at 4:01 p.m. and Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

June 6, 2007

Chairman Connelly called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Others in attendance included: Commissioners Archibald and Harmon; County Clerk, Jeanne Wagner and Commissioner's Secretary, Corey Roberts.

PARA 1: Additions to the agenda included: discussion of a board appointment. Commissioner Harmon moved to approve the agenda with the addition noted and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 2: Planning Director, John Woodward met with the Commissioners and gave an update to the agenda.

PARA 3: Commissioner Harmon moved to approve County Road Right-of-Way License #108-07 for Qwest and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 4: Jeanette Fagnant gave the development permit reports to the Commissioners.

PARA 5: John Woodward discussed 201 MS 07 – Thomas and Corina Crank with the Commissioners. Commissioner Archibald moved to approve 201 MS 07 with findings A-B, conditions of approval 1-3 and resolution of approval. Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 6: Jeanette discussed 203 MS 07 – Big Ridge Estates with the Commissioners. Commissioner Harmon moved to approve 203 MS 07 with findings of approval A-B, conditions of approval 1-3 and resolution of approval. Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 7: Jim Sessions met with the Commissioners on the letter he received from the BLM in regards to the Youth Camp that he wanted to hold at Pine Creek Ski Area. Their letter had restrictions and complaints and wouldn't allow some of the activities that he wanted to do. He has secured another area in order to hold this camp which will have youth attending from 4 different states. Commissioner Harmon stated they are trying to get the RPP lease amended for summer activities at Pine Creek.

PARA 8: Jeanette discussed 406 SS 07 – Michele Gagen with the Commissioners. Commissioner Archibald moved to approve 406 SS 07 with findings A-B and resolution of approval. Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 9: John discussed 109 PZ 07 – Howard Rhoads with the Commissioners. The applicant was not present, so a telephone conference was held. Commissioner Harmon moved to approve 109 PZ 07 with findings of approval A-B and conditions of approval 1-5. Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 10: John discussed 601 PZ 07 and 103 PZ 07 – Sterling Land Co., Mary McSorley with the Commissioners. There are 3 phases of this project which includes: a rezone, master plan, and follow-up discussion on the wastewater treatment proposed if the project is approved. Lennie Sorenson voiced concerns with the storage of RV's, Jordan Canyon Road easement, and snow removal within the project area. The architect of the project stated that trees would be planted and they would cover the site of seeing the top of a RV's stored on the project. He said snow removal would be taken care of by the 20 foot easement along the property in the project. He could not address the Jordan Canyon Road easement. Marlowe Scherbel addressed the road easement issue. The road has a public easement and full access to the public to the forest. Lennie's concerns dealt with paving the road by her property which would cause faster and more dangerous travel. John stated we are not at a platting stage with this project and it is just a master plan. The platting would show the easements at that time and would be addressed then. Lennie has water concerns also. Her water pressure has gone down considerably by growth in the area. This area should remain as a rural and not high density. Lennie requested that they deny the rezone and keep in compliance with the Code of the West. John explained how the P&Z looks at a project that wants a rezone and went through the findings of approval A-J with the Commissioners. Commissioner Harmon moved to approve 601 PZ 07 to rezone from rural to mixed with findings of approval A-J and resolution of approval. Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 11: Discussion was held on the second phase of the above project which is 103 PZ 07. Chairman Connelly had concerns with the snow removal and where the snow would be plowed and also runoff when the snow melts. The architect stated certain lots could accommodate snow storage and they could make an embankment steeper on the project to address additional snow storage. Lennie said there are concerns with the enhanced septic systems. There are noises with the pumps. With all the growth in the area, there is no one that provides services to maintain the enhanced septic systems. John said there is someone being trained in the area that will be able to support these projects. In regards to the noise with the blowers, he said they are on for 30 minute and off for 30 minute intervals. There are insulated noise shields that can be installed to help with this. Richard Christensen asked why the enhanced septic system can't be moved further on down the road, and that Mary McSorley has gotten everything she wanted from the Planning and Zoning and the Commissioners. He would like to see accommodations made to the landowners currently there in the area. Commissioner Harmon moved to approve 103 PZ 07 with findings of approval A-C and conditions of approval 1-5 with the addition of condition #6 to state: Identify snow storage areas in parking areas and #7 to state: Evaluate enhanced septic systems regarding noise and alternative connections to central system. Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 12: Commissioner Harmon moved to approve 806 AP 07 with findings of approval A-E and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 13: Commissioner Archibald moved to approve 807 AP 07 with findings of approval A-C and Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 14: A presentation was given on the addendum regarding the wastewater treatment plans for the original master plan for Targhee Landing Townhouse Planned Unit Development.

PARA 15: Sunrise Engineering gave a presentation/preview of the Afton Water Development Plan.

Commissioner Archibald moved to adjourn for lunch at 12:35 p.m. and Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried. Regular session resumed at 1:36 p.m.

PARA 16: Bob Rawlings met with the Commissioners and gave an agency update. Commissioner Harmon moved to sign the RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF TETON COUNTY TO PARTICIPATE WITH SUBLETTE COUNTY, LINCOLN COUNTY, AND UINTA COUNTY, TO COMPLETE A MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL INTEGRATED SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR THE PURPOSE OF COMPLYING WITH WYOMING STATUTE 35-11-1902. Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 17: Lara Sweeney with Wyoming Game & Fish met with the Commissioners on the Salt River Enhancement Project. They would like a letter of support from the Commissioners. Their support could help them get funding for the planning phase of this project. The Commissioners will draft a letter for them in support of this.

PARA 18: Gurn Brown met with the Commissioners on the Natural Resource Partnership Position. He is asking \$3,000 from the county for this position. The Commission will take this into consideration.

PARA 19: Commissioner Harmon moved to sign the following Addition/Reduction to Assessment Roll and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried. S.K. & S.J. PARA 20: Pat Cheek met with the Commissioners on a proposal to operate a landfill, recycle operation and R&D facility at the Stauffer Mine at Sage Junction or the Astaris site. He would prefer the Astaris site as his first option to lease about 50 acres of property from the county. This process would start with a Letter of Intent between Pat Cheek and Lincoln County for a good faith intent of the parties to work towards a mutually acceptable agreement. The Commissioners made no agreement on this and further investigation is needed into the project and other projects like what Mr. Cheek proposed.

PARA 21: Commissioner Harmon moved to approve the petition for a Private Road Access for Alan E. Merritt and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 22: Commissioner Archibald moved for the Chairman to sign the lease agreements with H & H Business for copier leases for county offices. Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 23: Commissioner Harmon moved to authorize the Chairman to sign the agreement with Qwest on the DSS Line and T1 Line and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 24: Commissioner Archibald moved to sign the Preventative Maintenance Agreement with Rocky Mountain Fire Systems, Inc. for the Branch Office Building and Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 25: Commissioner Harmon moved to appoint Paul Jenkins to the Afton/Lincoln County Airport Joint Powers Board to replace Mark Heiner with his term to begin July 1, 2007 and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 26: Commissioner Harmon moved to sign the FY08 WIC Agreement between Lincoln County and the Department of Health. Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 27: Commissioner Harmon authorized the Chairman to sign the contract with Thos Y. Pickett on Industrial Appraisal and Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 28: Commissioner Harmon moved for the Chairman to sign the parking lot, vault toilet agreement between Lincoln County and Bridger-Teton Forest Service at Smith's Fork. Commissioner Archibald seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PARA 29: Commissioner Archibald moved for the Chairman to sign the agreement between Lincoln County and Crank Companies for the Professional Service on Fontenelle Roads Reconstruction Project. Commissioner Harmon seconded the motion. Motion carried.
